RULES FOR NATIONAL BANKS.

Directors Must Meet Every Month the Comptroller Says.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20. — All of the national banks in the United States, which now hold board meetings at irregular and infrequent intervals, must have monthly meetings of their boards of directors, must appoint examining and discount committees and all the loans and discounts of each bank must be approved by the directorate at the monthly meeting such approval to be recorded in permanent form. This was the order of the comptroller of the currency, Mr. Murray.
