## WILL BRING SHANNON HERE

Local Protestant Churches Arrange For Revivals In February.

The Baptist, Christian, Methodist and Presbyterian churches of Marshfield have engaged Rev. Dan Shannon

to conduct a series of Evangelistic meetings to commence in February. They are arranging to build a tabernacle on Anderson avenue, near the Chandler hotel, that will hold about two thousand people.

A platform accommodating about two hundred singers will be a feature of this tabernacle.

The Shannon meetings closed at North Bend last evening when the revivalist addressed the converts. While not open for converts, it is said that eighteen additional ones went forward. It is said that in all, he converted 325 in North Bend and

that 125 of the number are men. The expense of the Tabernacle there was \$870 which is all paid. Rev. Shannon was given a free will offering of \$700. Next week, the Evangelist will go to California and will begin in Marshfield the middle of February.

### ALONG THE WATERFRONT.

San Francisco dispatches state that it is believed that the Homer, the Fritch line's steam schooner that went ashore there last week, can be pulled off and saved.

The Nann Smith sailed at 6:30 last evening for Bay Point and will probably make a fast trip to San Francisco as favorable weather is apparently prevailing along the coast.

Capt. B. W. Olson of the steamer "Nann Smith" reports the existence of an uncharted sunken rock 5-8 mile W. N. W. 1/4 W. (Mag.) (287 degrees 53 minutes new compass card) from Tower Rock, to the northward of Cape Blanco, Ore. Captain Olson estimates the depth to be about 10 to 12 feet as it breaks in a moderate swell. The rock is dangerous to vessels seeking shelter north of Blanco in southeast gales. Approximate latitude 52 degrees, 52 minutes, 50 seconds N.
