"Before being authorized by congress, the settlers of the present state of Tennessee organized a new state and called it Franklin. A full set of state officers were installed. when it was discovered that the new state was without authority, for the reason that the proposed act of congress had never been passed accepting the offer of the legislature of North Carolina. When the facts became generally known, the state of Franklin quickly vanished and the officers of the new state yielded to accident of the same sort. the government of North Carolina,"

North Carolina's offer, referred to when that state ceded to the general government all of the territory of the present state of Tennessee on condition that the cession be accepted within two years, but retained until that time full sovereignty. Congress ignored the request for recognition I love her in the winter, of the new state of Franklin and North Carolina promptly repealed the act of cession and asserted its jurisdiction. Six years later, in February, 1790, North Carolina again ceded the territory to the general government for the "territory south of the Ohlo." Six years later the new state was admitted to the Union.

So it is seen that with the cases of Kentucky, Tennessee, West Virginia and possibly others, there is ample precedent for the setting up of a new state from territory cut away from old states.
