POLITICS HOT IN WASHINGTON

**Many Want Senatorship From
Northern State — King
County's Plight.**

SEATTLE, Wash., Feb. 11.—It has just come to the ears of the King county politicians that Congressman Poindexter has been promised the support of several influential United States senators from the middle west in his fight to succeed S. H. Piles as United States senator from this state. If that prove true there are certainly some political

fireworks in store for the voters of the northwest. The senators who are said to have promised Poindexter support are of the insurgent stripe and they are said to be among the ablest orators in the senate. It is their intention, it is stated, to come to the state of Washington during the campaign and make a number of speeches in Poindexter's behalf.

King county expects to try to settle her senatorial muddle within the next few weeks. Senator Wilson, who it is reported will be a candidate to succeed Piles, is expected home next week. Judge Burke and John E. Humphries are still in the race. Humphries refuses to date to go into a primary for the purpose of determining who shall be the King county candidate. Burke says he is willing. John L. has written from the east that he is willing to do "what the other candidates are."

And there you are! It is conceded that unless King county gets behind one man there is no chance of landing the senatorship. With two strong men like Poindexter and Robert McCormick of Pierce county in the fight it is certain that King county would lose.

State Land Commissioner E. W. Ross came to the city this week and "nosed around" among local politicians. While Ross has not come out and said so it is a certainty that he will be a candidate for governor, unless he changes his mind. His political friends here admit that he has consulted them about entering the fight; that they have advised him to do so and that he has assured them that he will make the race.

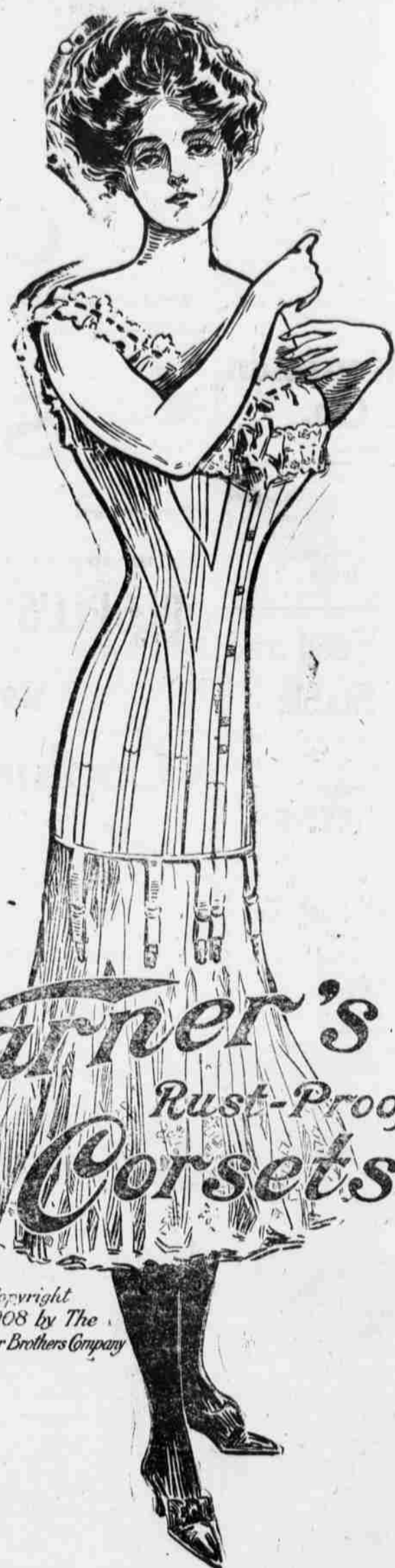
PASS "WHITE SLAVE" BILL.
