## HEARING WILL LAST ALL WEEK

Many Witnesses Called for Investigation of Charges Against Life Savers.

The investigation of the charges against the Coos Bay Life Saving crew in connection with the Czarina disaster was continued until this afternoon by Lieut. Joynes this morning owing to J. M. Upton, who is representing Capt. Boies, having to go to Coquille this morning. This afternoon, Capt. B. W. Olson of the Nann Smith will complete his testimony.

The hearing may possibly be completed this week. A number of witnesses are to be called yet. A complete transcript of the testimony is being taken by Miss Violet Henderson for Lieut. Joynes.

While the evidence has not been given out, it is understood that considerable of it is favorable to Capt. Boies and his crew.

So far the following witnesses have been called:

Jack Melville and Scot Nicholson, two fishermen, who were called upon by Capt. Boies and his crew to assist.

Messrs. Barcey, Pederson and Wilson, former members of life saving crews, who witnessed the disaster.

Cecil Holland, who preferred the charges against the crew.

Dr. E. Mingus, who was a witness of the disaster.

Fred K. Gettins, who took the official measurements of the distance the Czarina went aground from shore.

Capt. B. W. Olson, of the Nann Smith.

C. R. Peck, attorney for the Port of Coos Bay Commission, is also present at the investigation and is seeing that all questions concerning the matter are being brought out.
