HUSHING UP.

THE charge was made in the Pinchot-Bullinger committee that Attorney General Wickersham wrote the exoneration of Bullinger, on which President Taft was said to have based his letter for Bullinger, three months after the president's letter had been published, and dated it back to cover the discrepancy and relieve the president of embarrassment.

The attorney general has refused to say anything about the matter or to make any statement. And the investigating committee has taken the ground that it is not investigating the attorney general and therefore that the fact is not within the scope of its inquiry. In other words a charge affecting the good faith not only of the attorney general, but also of the president is deliberately smothered, and the exoneration of Bullinger is left open to all sorts of suspicion.

It is just such things as this that give the public a feeling that there is no such thing as an impartial inquiry into the actions of public officials whose conduct in any way involves the fortunes of the higher up. Why should it not be proper to know whether in fact the attorney general's exoneration of Bullinger was hatched up to cover a lot of exposed tracks? That is what the investigation is for in the eyes of the public—to get at the whole inner history of the Bullinger administration.

Nothing the committee could have brought out by inquiry could have been half as damaging as hushing up the date of the Wickersham letter. The public will measure the verdict of the committee in the light of this one incident.

SAN FRANCISCO BOOSTERS.

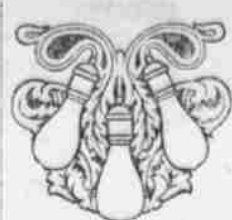
