People are coming to look at Coos Bay more and more as the railroad projects assume definite shape. There are a number of influences which are working at this time to boost our community as it has never been boosted before. What is Coos Bay? Where is it? How big is it? How many people are there in Coos County? These are the questions which are being asked and the census now being enumerated will answer the last two questions. All the boosting literature which we can issue will not change the public's idea of our population—the official census taken by Uncle Sam is the measure by which cities are calculated.

Every man in the city should see to it that the members of his family are fully enumerated. Every single man and woman should make it a point to be on the census rolls. Find out if your neighbors were home when the enumerator called. See to it that the questions were answered correctly. COMETS TAIL NOW VISIBLE

Heavenly Visitor Is on Dress Parade in Sky This Morning.

The Comet's Here.

The telephone girl now tells us there's a comet in the sky which is quite apparent to the nude observant eye.

Are the scientific telescopic comet finders sure That the comity of comets will eternally endure?

The comet has arrived. There is no question now as to the identity of the heavenly visitor. It is here with all its golden glory and a tail that's longer than the Coos Bay and Boise railway. Several in Marshfield witnessed it about three o'clock this morning in all its blazing brilliancy in the eastern sky. The air was clear and the view was magnificent. Oregon—Coos Bay entrance—North spit jetty bell buoy, 1A, established April 18, 1910, in the place of north spit jetty buoy 1 1/2, a 2d-class can, which was then discontinued.

Oregon—Siuslaw river entrance—Buoy established April 16, 1910, as follows:

Siuslaw river whistling buoy, "S", PS, in 90 feet of water, in the place of Siuslaw river buoy, "S", PS, 2d-class can, which was then discontinued.

Outer buoy, PS 2d-class can, in 55 feet of water, about 500 feet (1/2 mile) outside the bar.
