All of us have been, and most of us look back upon that period of infantile subconsciousness either with entire indifference or a vague reminiscent feeling of pleasant gratitude.

But some of us—that is to say, some babies—find that land of dim surmise not a pleasant place to recall. There are those who wonder they ever got through it all, and others that find in it only cause for bitterness and blind resentment.

It is to help such babies—those who have not had a chance—that Dr. Lindsay Wynekoop of Chicago suggests a more general system of child adoption.

"I had four children," said Mrs. Wynekoop at a recent meeting of mothers in Rockford, Ill., "and still I questioned myself closely, and knew that I had the time and money for another child, so I adopted one. I think it was my duty toward the race."

There are many women who, like Mrs. Wynekoop, have the money and the time and yet lack the inclination to increase their responsibilities. The cause is not so much selfishness as a false view of happiness. Life holds no higher gratification than the consciousness of service well performed. The training of children, taken all in all, surpasses bridge or motoring in its simple potentialities of amusement and diversion.

Mrs. Wynekoop may perceive in motherhood too radical a sense of state responsibility, but the example she sets is wholesome and opens up infinite possibility for some of her less occupied sisters. For here is a service which goes to the very soul of things and for the successful performance of which every normal woman is particularly qualified.
