#### SEALING UP OREGON LANDS.

APPROXIMATELY 2,300,000 acres of Oregon land has been sealed up by an iron-clad monopoly since 1903 by what is known as the Oregon & California Railroad Company grant.

After selling 820,000 acres of the primary grants between 1866 and 1903 at from \$5 to \$40 and even more an acre, thus realizing as much as Congress ever intended should be gained by the railway from the whole transaction, the company has now arbitrarily withdrawn the remaining lands from the market.

After years of waiting and petitioning was at last rewarded by having the Federal Government take legal steps to cancel title of the railway company to at least its remaining holdings, or compel opening the 2,300,000 acres to regular entry of settlers.

That was the history up to commencement of the cancellation suit. A more depressing chapter has been written since. After an able report covering the facts of the case, and a most commendable legal presentation of the issues, there has been the strangest lapse of energy ever witnessed in court controversies of Oregon.

Recently the long-delayed brief for the Government was filed. Another chapter has opened.

Thousands of people are waiting. An acreage that would accommodate a multitude of prosperous, sturdy Oregon citizens is withheld pending final

decision. And no petty excuse of lawyers, no trivial rules of procedure can defeat the public demand.

This vastly important suit, which reveals a wrong in a peculiarly aggravating light at this time of the homeseekers' rush, must be prosecuted with due diligence.
