PROGRAM OF COOS COUNTY RACING ASSOCIATION.

At Marshfield, Oregon, July 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th, 1910.

First Day, Friday, July 1st. (Racing starts each day at 2 p. m. sharp.)

RACE 1—Running, 5-8 mile dash, purse \$125.00

RACE 2—Trotting and pacing, 1/2 mile heats, 2:30 class, best two out of three, purse 100.00

RACE 3—Half mile Burro race, purse 5.00

RACE 4—100 yard foot race, (medals for first and second places).

RACE 5—Running 3-8 mile dash, for horses owned and kept in Coos and Curry counties since January 1st, 1910, catch weights, purse 75.00

No. 5 1/2—Running broad jump, (medals for first and second places).

RACE 6—Relay race for saddle horses of eight miles. The relay race is to cover four days, two miles are to be run each day, riders to change horses every half mile. The winner will be declared the fourth day. Purse 100.00

Second Day, Saturday, July 2nd.

RACE 7—3/4 mile dash, purse 175.00

RACE 8—Pacing and trotting, 1/2 mile heats, for 2:15 class, best two out of three, purse 150.00

RACE 9—220 yard foot race (medals for first and second places.)

RACE 10—Burro race, 1/2 mile dash to harness, purse 5.00

No. 10 1/2—Running high jump, (medals for first and second places).

RACE 11—1/4 mile dash, catch weights, for horses not trained this season, purse 20.00

RACE 12—Running 5-8 mile. Owners handicapped for horses kept and owned in Coos county since January 1st, 1910, purse 125.00

RACE 13—Relay race (same as No. 6).

Third Day, Sunday, July 3rd.

RACE 14—Running 1/2 mile dash. For horses owned and kept in Coos and Douglas counties since January 1st, 1910, catch weights, purse 100.00

RACE 15—Free for all. Trotting and pacing, 1/2 mile, best three out of five, purse 175.00

RACE 16—220 yard hurdle race, (medals for first and second places).

RACE 17—Running, one mile dash, purse 175.00

RACE 18—Relay race, (same as No. 6).

Fourth Day, Monday, July 4th.

RACE 19—Running half mile dash, for horses owned and kept in Coos county, since January 1st, 1910. Catch weights, purse 100.00

RACE 20—440 yard foot race, (medals for first and second places).

RACE 21—Trotting and pacing 1 mile heats, best three out of five, free for all, purse 250.00

No. 20 1/2—Pole vault, (medals for first and second places).

RACE 22—Running, 3-8 mile catch weights, horses not trained this season, purse 30.00

RACE 23—1/2 mile relay race, silver trophy.

RACE 24—Running one mile dash, purse 200.00

RACE 25—Relay (same as No. 6).

Fifth Day, Tuesday, July 5th.

RACE 26—Running 1/2 mile consolation for horses not winning any money at this meeting, purse 100.00

RACE 27—Running 1/2 mile match race between Cardwell, King Kohr and Seeley's McBeth.

RACE 28—(Special).

RACE 29—Automobile race.
