WILL BE GOOD

Much Interest in Saturday
Night's Events at Marsh-
field Skating Rink.

There is nothing like a novelty attraction, something unique and altogether uncommon. People, particularly those with sporting proclivities, will hike countless miles to see something which promises a new diversion. In the boxing carnival to be staged Saturday night at the Marshfield Skating Rink, there will appear the only Chinaman who ever stepped into a roped arena before an audience as a fistie exponent worthy the name. One or two other Chinamen have attempted fistiana, but none have made good and they were inveigled into the game by promoters simply as an advertisement.
