FORESTS OF THE NORTH.

CAPITALISTS have long had wistful eyes on the splendid forests of Southeastern Alaska. A recent bulletin of the Department of Agriculture says that in this locality the annual average rainfall is about ninety inches and the trees grow to a large size. In the central plateau of Alaska the precipitation is less than fifteen inches and the average size of timber is small.

The total forest area of Alaska is approximately 100 million acres, about twenty-seven per cent of the land area. Of this about twenty million acres bear timber of sufficient size and density to be used as saw timber.

The stand of trees averages for considerable areas, 25,000 feet per acre. The usual timber cut in the coast forests of Alaska is about 27,000,000 board feet, almost entirely spruce. The southern and southeastern coast having a much larger timber supply than will be needed locally for a long time to come, much of the hemlock should be cut and the spruce given an opportunity to increase. The cutting that has so far taken place on the coast of Alaska has had but small effect upon the forest; the bulk is yet untouched.

SIZE OF THE SEA.

An officer of a steamer once remarked to the writer that most men seem to be as ignorant about the size of the sea as they are of the distance between the heavenly planets. Here are a few facts: The Pacific covers 68,000,000 miles; the Atlantic 30,000,000 and the Indian Ocean, Arctic and Antarctic 42,000,000. To stow away the contents of the Pacific it would be necessary to fill a tank one mile long, one mile wide and one mile deep, every day for 44 years. Put in figures the Pacific holds in weight 948,000,000,000,000,000 tons. The Atlantic averages a depth of not quite three miles. Its waters weigh 325,000,000,000,000,000 tons and a tank to contain it would have each of its sides 430 miles long. The figures of the other oceans are in the same startling proportions. It would take all the sea water in the world 2,000,000 years to flow over Niagara. A tank to hold it would have to measure nearly 1,000 miles along each of its sides.
