FRUIT GROWERS' ASSOCIATION.

EARLY in the year 1908 the first movement was inaugurated in this city for the organization of a fruit growers' association in Coos county. This organization has proven a success in a measure. It is a step in the right direction, but the fruit growers have never stepped far enough.

There is a field and a demand for a more complete and far reaching organization than any now operating in the county. Instead of several small and weak associations, there should be one big, stalwart organization embracing every orchardist and fruit grower in Coos county.

The fruit men of California have long benefited from such a plan. Hood River took up the idea and has prospered immensely under its workings. Wenatchee has repeated the success of Hood River.

The whole situation simmers down to this: Without organization, ranchers and fruitgrowers are at the mercy of the middlemen. By reason of his connections and knowledge of the market he is able to dictate prices. The individual has no connection and very limited means of learning the real market situation. In the last analysis he is compelled to take what he can get or let his fruit decay on the trees.

The commission man is not to blame because he takes advantage of this situation. All men would do likewise under similar conditions. The rancher alone is to blame. It's simply a case of "root, hog, or die," and possibly when the situation threatens to become serious enough to affect his pocketbook, he will show more of a disposition to lend his energy toward the perfecting of an offensive and defensive alliance. Of course, there must be leaders who may be trusted perfectly, but just as essential must be the real spirit of co-operation and of pulling together.

Suppose, for instance, that a considerable percentage of the perishable fruits go to waste this season, what will be the loss to this community? Hundreds and perhaps thousands of dollars. Add to this the loss from the by-products of the fruit industry which might be utilized by a cannery. More thousands of dollars. All of this money might, under a well-oiled and smoothly-working system, be saved to the good people of this section for the enrichment of their families and the well-being of the community generally. Is there not a wise old adage which reads: "A penny saved is as good as a penny earned?"
