50,000 DIE OF CHOLERA

Awful Suffering and Death Brought By Disease to People of Russia.

(By Associated Press.)
 ST. PETERSBURG, August 20. — One week's cholera record in Russia shows nearly 24,000 new cases and nearly 11,000 deaths, bringing the total in Russia this year to 112,000 cases. Of these, over 50,000 resulted fatally, the mortality per centage being 44.5.

FRUIT MEN TO COME TO COOS

Representatives of Big California Concerns May Establish Plants Here.

Representatives of two of the largest dried-fruit concerns will be here in a couple of weeks to look over this field with a view of putting in two large fruit plants here, one to be located at Marshfield and the other at Myrtle Point or Coquille. Whether the plants are located here will depend on the ability of the concerns to contract with the growers for sufficient fruit of various kinds to make the plants advisable.

This news was brought here by F. S. Dow, who has just returned from San Francisco. He reports that general conditions at San Francisco are improving rapidly, the past three weeks having wrought a remarkable change.

MILLS TO BE IDLE.

Curtailment is Announced By Eastern Cotton Manufacturers.

BOSTON, August 19. — Millions of spindles in the cotton mills of the country will be idle in periods varying from one week to sixteen days during the latter part of this month and the first half of September. The mills in New England employing 50,000 operatives have already posted notices of further curtailment.
