

FEDERAL AUTO LICENSE.

ERIOUS ATTENTION is being given to the matter of a federal license for autoists that will facilitate travel from State to State without the annoying necessity of stopping at every State line to procure a new license, is the comment of the Omaha Bee. It is the same difficulty here that has come up in Europe, where, as American tourists know, it is necessary to obtain a license at the border of each country. This entails additional expense and endless annoyance and inconvenience and has given rise to a demand for an international license abroad. Europe is likely to heed the demand, too, for it is not indifferent to the fact that American tourists in all are leaving something like \$400,000,000 over there each year and sums of this sort count in business transactions.

But in the United States, while the antolst enjoys many rights which some people think he should not have, he is here to stay, and automobiling is more than mere pleasure, and he has rights which ought to L respected. One of them is this very right of interstate travel. It ought not be necessary for him to pay a new license fee every time he comes to a State line, or to rely on reciprocal courtesy. Such a fee acts as nothing more or less than an additional tax. A federal license might, of course, be objected to by States that were unwilling to forfeit the income from license fees, but this could be compensated in the form of taxes. Placing automobiles under a federal license might also lead to a solution of the auto problem, if such we may call it. As popular as are automobiles their running and speed must bo better regulated than they have yet been and it is quite probable that a federal provision could be made to fit the case with satisfactory results.
