TELLS OF E. H. MEADE. Story Regarding Manager of the Margaret Iles Company. A press telegram from Alturas, Cal., gives an interesting story regarding E. H. Meade, manager of the Margaret Iles Company, who is well known here. The company has given performances a number of times in Marshfield and the members became well acquainted with the local people. The story is as follows: E. H. Meade, manager of the Margaret Iles Theatrical Company, has discovered that Daniel Hoag, for whom the Hoag Mine in the Bidwell mining district was named, was his grandfather. Mr. Hoag was last heard from by his family in the early 60's, about the time of the Civil War, and had not been heard of from that time until Mr. Meade's recent trip to Bidwell, when in conversation with some of the old settlers his name came up, and by comparing notes Mr. Meade discovered the relationship. Mr. Hoag was well known all through the Bidwell section, where he rendered valuable service as a scout during the Indian troubles. There has been in the past a great deal of discussion as to how Hoag was killed, some claiming he was shot by the Indians during a raid on the Indian camps, and others claim that he was shot by one of the soldiers, on account of his work in scouting and locating Indian camps, which necessitated the soldiers going out after them. As winter was the best time to catch the Indians, the soldiers had to undergo a great many hardships. As Hoag was shot in the back of the head while the soldiers were charging a camp, it looks as though the theory of his being killed by a soldier, and not by an Indian, is taken as the correct one. Mr. Hoag, at the time of his death, was a partner of Mr. Whitmore, who after Hoag's death, no heirs having been found, succeeded to the entire business, which, from the fact that Whitmore was rated as a wealthy man, must have been of considerable value. If the ubiquitous, and superfluous, candidate for political honors and pelf, would take an hour off and weigh himself on someone's scales, we might be rid of a lot of trouble, and he would be spared from slaughter.
