MECHANICAL LIGHTKEEPERS.

MUCH of the romance of the seas was shattered by the steam whistle that shrieked the doom of the sailing vessel. Now modern inventors have jeopardized the positions of thousands of lighthouse keepers whose occupation is almost as romantic as was that of the old deep water sailors, and which antedates the birth of Christ three centuries. It is a far cry from the beacons of burning wood in the time of the Pharaohs to the automatic gas buoys that are government sign-posts for sailors in nearly every harbor, but now invention has gone farther. An acetylene lamp has been perfected that will make the work of human lightkeepers superfluous. The new lamps need replenishing only once a year and may receive only occasional visits from inspectors to make sure that their reflectors are undimmed and that all the machinery is in smooth working order. The mechanical effect of light rays is used to perform automatic marvels. When darkness falls, the light goes up. When daylight returns, the artificial beam ceases. The daylight acts upon the valves that do this work.

CONSERVATION IN CALIFORNIA.

IT HAS been insisted by Ballinger et al that the conservation movement was entirely eastern in organization and idea. Private interests in the east had obtained complete control of all the native resources. Therefore they could afford to blockade private interests in the far west which were working to gobble such resources as were at hand. The primary elections in California have given the lie to that contention. Several of the largest of the forest reserves are in California. Water power, still undeveloped, has for a long time been watering the mouths of many California promoters and finance manipulators. Some of the streams and rivers have an immense potential value for irrigation purposes, and private groups would like to have settlers and farmers pay them rental for the service. A few square miles unexplored by the oil prospectors are still under the government title and there are a few tracts of land in the possession of the Indians. If pure greed controlled the whole of a community it would be in California to-day.

The primary elections prove that the conservation movement is strong in the State. The Ballingers and the Hepburns are in a clear minority. Californians realize that temporary advantage, which might be gained by immediate development under private capital, can be foregone in order that the greater advantage of a wise public development may be harvested.
