Captain of Breakwater Says **Boat Has Been Doing Great** Ocean Traveling.

The steamer Breakwater has made Bay. The following under a big headliner appeared in the Oregonian:

"When the steamer Breakwater swung into her dock yesterday afternoon, arriving from Coos Bay, she completed a record which Capt. Macgenn proudly declares has not, in his knowledge, been equaled by any vessel affoat

The staunch little steamer has for nearly five months maintained a fiveday schedule from this port to Coos Bay, making 600 nautical miles each round trip, and in that time, her captain declares, has not been off her schedule an hour at any time.

"Regardless of fog, wind or bar conditions, the vessel has swung back and forth with the regularity of a pendlum, crossing in and out when the bar was forbidding to other craft, carrying large loads of freight and thousands of passengers.

In all 26 trips were made on the five-day schedule, aggregating 15,-600 mles of travel. The schedule was abandoned because the traffic conditions did not warrant so frequent a service. Hereafter the Breakwater will make a trip every week, beginning Tuesday and having two layover days each trip at this end.
