THE CITY FLY ORDINANCE IS RIGID

NEW REGULATIONS WHICH AFFECT DEALERS IN FODSTUFFS AND OWNERS OF HORSES AND COWS IN MARSHFIELD SOON EFFECTIVE.

ORDINANCE NO. 452.

An ordinance to protect the public health and to prevent the spread of filth and of contagious and infectious diseases by means of flies and other insects.

THE CITY OF MARSHFIELD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be the duty of every grocer, hotel keeper, owner or manager of a restaurant, boarding house, meat market or store, or any building or place other than a private dwelling house, where meats and vegetables, fruit or food stuffs are kept for sale or consumption, to keep all such meats, vegetables, fruits and food stuffs, that are in their nature susceptible of contamination in any manner, by or from flies or other insects, at all times, properly and securely screened and protected from contact with such flies or insects, by proper glass, wood or metal receptacles or covers, or by mesh screens, from which all flies and other insects shall be at all times excluded.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of every owner, manager, tenant, lessee or person in charge of any stable, barn, shed, shelter or structure of whatever nature, within the City of Marshfield, occupied by or used for the housing or protection of one or more horses or cows, to provide and use one or more proper receptacles, so constructed of metal, wood or screening that flies and other insects cannot gain access to the interior thereof, and to clean and disinfect the same at least once each day.

thereof, and shall at least as often as once each day collect all the accumulations, upon said premises, of manure and excrement from such animal or animals, deposit the same in such receptacle or receptacles and carefully close or cover the same in such manner as to prevent the access of flies or other insects to the contents thereof.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of all persons, subject to the provisions of this ordinance to provide themselves with the articles and appliances required by the terms hereof, within ten (10) days after the passage and approval of this ordinance.

Section 4. Any person, who shall violate any of the terms or provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5.00), nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), and the continuance of such violation shall be deemed a new offense for each day on which the same is continued and shall be punishable accordingly.

Section 5. Whereas, the continued exposure of food stuffs to contact with flies and other insects and the exposure of manure and animal excrement to contact with such flies and insects, constitute a constant menace to the health of the community, for this reason it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the city that this ordinance should become immediately operative.

Section 6. Therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall become operative immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Passed and enacted this 5th day of September, 1910.

NOTICE OF SALE OF IMPROVEMENT BONDS.

Notice is hereby given that sealed proposals will be received by the Finance Committee of the Common Council of the City of Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon, at the office of the City Recorder of said City of Marshfield, in the City Hall of said City, until 4 o'clock P. M. of TUESDAY, the 27th day of September, 1910, for the purchase of street improvement bonds to the amount of \$15,055.27, of the said City of Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon.

All of said improvement bonds to be in denominations not exceeding \$500 and bearing interest at the rate of six per centum per annum from date thereof, payable semi-annually; said bonds to be dated the day of issuance and to mature in ten years thereafter, with prepayment option thereon at face value and accrued interest to date of any semi-annual coupon interest period at, or after, one year from the date of said bonds, upon giving notice by publication in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in Coos county, Oregon, such notice to be published not less than twice during the month preceding such semi-annual period at which such prepayment thereof will be made. The right is expressly reserved to reject any and all bids and upon all or any of such bids, or proposals, being rejected, if there should remain any bonds unsold, the said bonds may be thereafter sold at private sale by said Common Council of said City of Marshfield, Oregon; but in no event to be sold at less than par and accrued interest. Said bonds are authorized by the laws of the State of Oregon and ordinances of the Common Council of the said City of Marshfield, Oregon.

Assessed valuation of said City of Marshfield, Oregon, is \$1,791,549.
Bonds indebtedness is \$54,000.
Population—Estimated at 5,000.

A certified check for 5 per centum of amount of bid, or proposal must accompany each bid to be forfeited to said City of Marshfield in case bid is accepted and bidder fails to accept and make payment for said bond or bonds, covered thereby, within ten days from date of acceptance of said bid or bids.

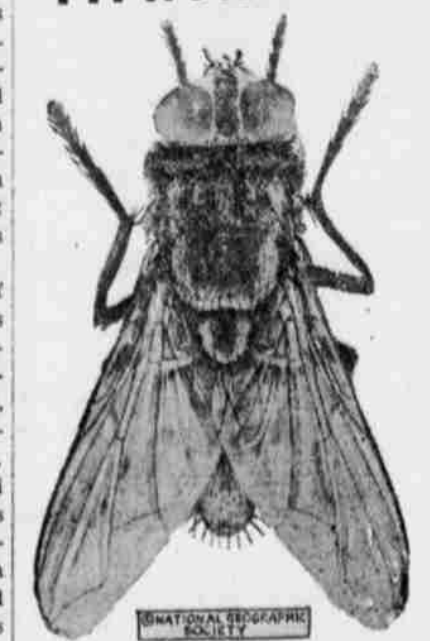
Each bid or proposal submitted to designate the denominations of said bond or bonds desired.
