Only a very small number of voters have registered thus far. The registration closes for the primaries September 14th, and any man whose name does not appear in the registration books will not be allowed to vote in the primary election September 24th. The law is rigid and does not permit an elector to swear in his vote at the primaries, as is done at the general election. If you do not register you cannot vote at the primaries.
