THE GREAT QUESTION confronting the people of Oregon just now is that of registration. No one can vote at the primary who fails to register before September 15th. Every vote should be cast at the primary election. Every voter should be present at the primary booths.

The basis of our governmental system is participation by the people in our elections. Our officials are chosen and our policies decided by the people at the ballot box. If people generally should refrain from voting, our entire system of government would be menaced, if not destroyed.

This year we are called upon to take an active part in the primary election as well as in the general election. The duty of participating in the primary is just as binding as that of participating in the election of November. We cannot have good government unless we have good men nominated for official places. If the people should neglect to go to the primaries, the best men could not be nominated. That is because the evil elements always look after these matters, and they will take advantage of the indifference on the part of the general public to choose men who will be subservient to them. There can be no possible escape from this conclusion. Its correctness is shown by our political history during a hundred years. Whenever there has been indifference in the matter of participating in elections, evil elements have secured the mastery. Whenever the entire people have aroused themselves and taken part, the undestorable elements have been submerged.

It will be just as dangerous to neglect the primary as it would be to neglect the general election. The duty of participating in the primary is just as great as that of participating in the election that occurs later. We reiterate this because we fear there are some people who do not realize that this primary election is just as important as the one to be held in November. We will jeopardize good government by neglecting the primary just as much as we would jeopardize it by neglecting to vote at the time when the officials are to be elected.
