Notice is hereby given that all property owners within 100 feet of a street in which there is a sewer or less than half a block (no matter how large the block is) from a sewer must connect up with sewer within fifteen days from date of this notice. Said connection must be made by a licensed plumber.

TO HOLD BIG LAND AUCTION

(By Associated Press.)
WASHINGTON, Sept. 13.—What is declared to be the largest auction sale of lands ever offered at one time will take place on the Crow, Mont., and the Uinta, Utah, Indian reservations on October 15th and November 1st next, respectively. About 1,500,000 acres of land suitable principally for dry farming and grazing is involved. The lands in the Crow reservation comprise about 800,000 acres and will be sold at Billings, Mont., at not less than \$2.00 an acre, one-fifth payable in cash and the remainder in four annual installments without interest. In the Uinta reservation approximating 700,000 acres, will be sold at Provo, Utah, at not less than fifty cents per acre payable in cash.

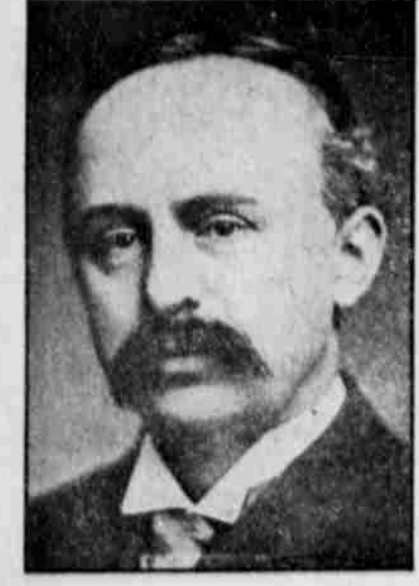
