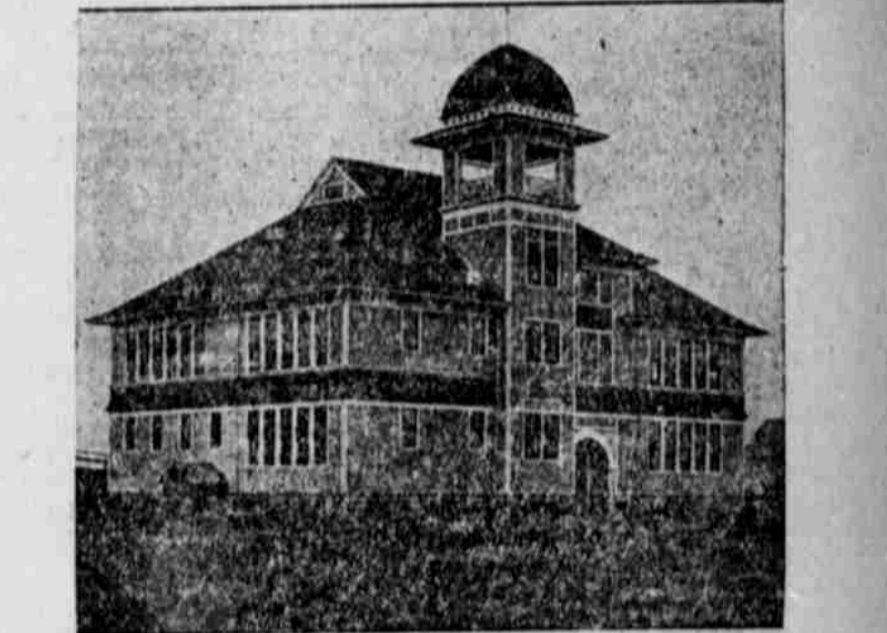

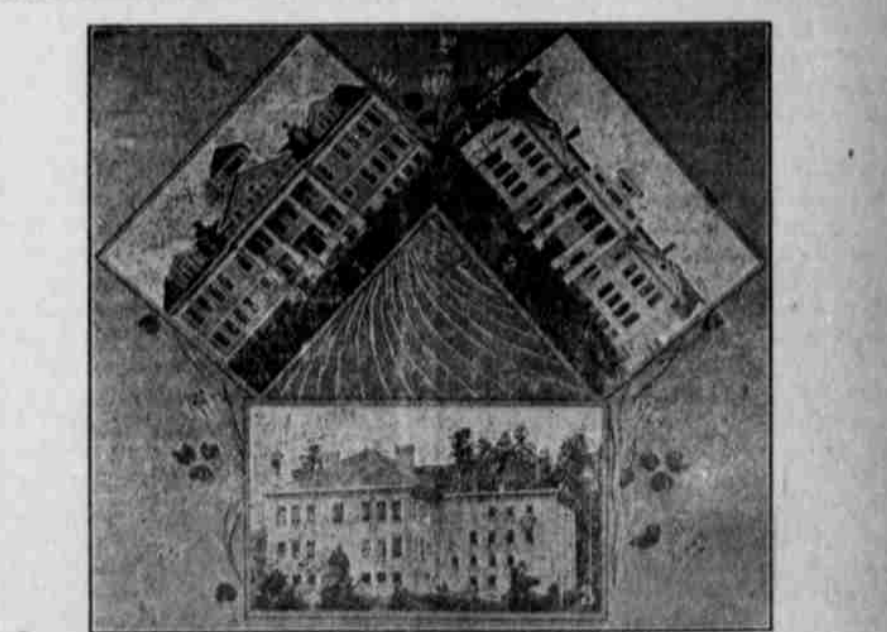


CENTRAL SCHOOL BUILDING, NORTH BEND.
