ARE AGAINST THE ASSEMBLY

Members of Oregon Grange Will Strongly Oppose Assembly Candidates.

Sometime since, A. Haberly, lecturer of the Bandon Grange, stated in a letter to The Times that the Grange was officially and absolutely against the Assembly. This was denied by the secretary of the Bandon Grange, but now comes the State organizer of the grange and the man who organized the Bandon Grange and confirms Mr. Haberly. He says that not only is the Grange against the Assembly, but that it was the first to go on record against it. In a letter to a Portland paper, Cyrus H. Walker of Albany, who is well known in Coos county, says:

"In this anti-Assembly, Bourne is a mere incident." It is also true that "the resistance had its beginning in the great movement among the Oregon granges." Beginning quite early last fall, grange after grange in different sections of Oregon passed resolutions against the Assembly, until in May the State grange of Oregon, at Oregon City, drove the last spike that completed the circuit.

We never know when to believe what the Oregonian gives us editorially along political lines, and some other lines as well. * * * Having read the Oregonian more or less for nearly sixty years (reading the very first numbers), for years I took a pride in it; now I am disgusted with it.

The anti-Assembly sentiment is stronger, perhaps, in Linn than in any other Oregon county. For one thing, we have more granges than any other county. As a rule the farmers regard the grange as an exponent of their ideas, and whatever action it takes the farmers as a majority fall in with. Grand Prairie Grange, No. 19, near Albany, at its last meeting, decided to hold public meetings to discuss the different measures going upon the ballot for November's election. All the Oregon granges will no doubt more or less discuss them, and we farmers and laboring men will know as well as the Assembly fellows what we are voting for, if we are not so informed at the present. It is said that the ostrich, when pursued and finding itself run down, hides its head in the sand, imagining it is concealed from its pursuers. This applies to the present status of the assemblyites.

Last Tuesday was Grange day at the Linn county fair. * * * The remark was made and assented to that, outside of the towns, nine out of ten of the people were against the Assembly.

There will be some mighty surprises the next morning after the primaries are held on the 24th inst., and still greater ones the morning of the 5th of November. By that time it will be fully demonstrated that "government of the people, by the people, for the people" has not "perished from" Oregon. **CYRUS H. but he did have much to say about this all-important theme. He too time to deliver whole parables upon this subject. Hence it must be an important theme.

"Nearness to the Kingdom is not enough.
