ROSE WILL BEGIN CAMPAIGN.

Prohibition Losing Ground, Says Milwankee ex-Mayor.

David S. Rose, ex-mayor of Milwaukee, arrived in Portland yesterday morning to begin his compaign of speaking in the state on behalf of the Greater Oregonian Home-Rule association, says the Portland Oregonian. For nearly two years Mr. Rose has been delivering lectures and addresses on temperance as against prohibition. He has spoken in all parts of the United States where the liquor question was an issue and will deliver 25 addresses in Oregon,

"I have spoken in 149 communities where the liquor question was before the people," said Mr. Rose "and only four out of that number voted dry. They were South Farmington and Plymouth, Mass., Davenport, Wash., and Lincoln, Neb. That alone speaks for the sentiment of the public against prohibition.

"Prohibition became effective in Alabama January 1, 1909, and on . November 29 of the same year constitutional prohibition was defeated | by an overwhelming majority of 27,000 votes. Besides that, Emmett O'Neill, who led the fight, was nominated for Governor.
