For the purpose of organizing a division of the Oregon Naval Reserve here and if possible to organize two divisions, H. C. Stone arrived here from Portland this morning. It requires forty men for a division and it is not believed that any difficulty will be encountered in effecting the organization of the divisions here.

The Naval Reserve bears nearly the same relation to the United States navy that the National Guard does to the United States army with the exception that the ties are not so stringent. The men are required to enlist for a period of three years but the enlistment is not nearly so binding as in the National Guard.

Washington and California have strong Naval Reserves but Oregon has not attempted to organize one until the past summer. Besides the benefit to the men, it is beneficial to the ports, as it means that at least once a year some of the smaller vessels of the navy will put in here to take the members of the Naval Reserve on a two weeks' cruise.

"We have organized one division in Portland and expect to have another one there shortly," said Mr. Stone this morning. "One or two divisions will also be organized at Astoria and we hope to have two on Coos Bay. I am going to spend some little time here to get the boys started and arrange for a drill hall and armory, etc. We expect to develop some mighty good boating crews and will make this one feature of the work."

"At Portland, the Chamber of Commerce is taking hold of the matter and is assisting in raising funds for uniforms for the men. The uniforms cost \$4.35 each. "The Naval Reserve will not only prove beneficial to the young men who enter it, but will be a big boost for Oregon ports as it will mean that the warships will pay more attention to these harbors."

"We expect to have the battleship Oregon stationed here for us regularly and every summer to have some of the smaller vessels come for the two weeks practice cruise."

Mr. Stone is stopping at the Chandler and will probably be here several weeks to get the division or divisions properly started.
