RESTORATION OF PARTY ORGANIZATION.

THE meeting of the Marshfield Republican Club last evening made up in interest and enthusiasm what it may have lacked in numbers.

There was a general and cordial acceptance of the get-together policy and a determination to do some effective work for the party during the remaining weeks of the campaign.

The brief talks by a number of those present evidenced a desire to restore the Republican party to its own in Coos county and the state. Harmony and haste were the twin watch words of the evening.

This concerted action of Republicans of varying shades of belief in the general policy of the party is a healthy indication of an honest effort to restore the party organization, party principles and party prestige. It is not necessary to set up a new party by name or men. The title Republican is good enough for ages to come, and its use for all time will have the effect of fixing the credit for its loftier thought and nobler action exactly where it belongs, and perpetuate it righteously. A ratification of the higher, straighter, cleaner line of thought, principle and action which Republicans have originated and which Republicans have endorsed, redounds to the abiding honor of the Republican party. This ratification comes in a reunion of all Republicans and their concerted action to restore the party organization. Men are getting closer together and giving thought to ideas that have been overlooked for years and every tendency is to a re-knitting of the Republican party.

Let us go ahead with our new work and establish it as the sequent, authentic act of the Republican party, and thus restrict the great honor to ourselves and our successors. We can, and should do this thing, since it is our duty as Republicans and the people will back the movement with a strength and sanction that will be at once imperative and deliberate.

Every Republican of Marshfield should be enrolled as a member of this club and thus lend his influence to the perpetuation of the principles and the party which it is proposed to restore to place and power in Coos county and in Oregon.

OUT of the tale of incredible horrors sent us from Minnesota Coos and her sister counties of the coast must find strong warning against a repetition of those frightful losses and fiendish acts born of human desperation. In this section stands one of the last and great strongholds of the timbering interests of the country; here we have massed the wonderful virgin forests that yet invite the threat of such visitation and it is up to us to guard keenly and constantly against the awful chance of destruction and death inseparable from it.

We Americans are loud in proclaiming ourselves the "live wires" of the age and boasting of our shrewdness in handling our great interests; but we are babbling children when it comes to the preservation of our forests, as compared with the adroit and successful measures employed abroad in similar cases. It is time we were waking up, as states, if the government cannot devise sounder and surer expedients for this work. The Times is pleased to acknowledge the excellent work of the Coos County Fire Patrol this last season in helping preserve this splendid resource.

We have much to be thankful for this year in our freedom from great fires; and this should move us to unite with every movement on the coast that tends to save our trees and the enormous business dependent upon them. The people everywhere are in exact temper for the promulgation of the most rigid steps in this behalf and ready to sacrifice much if only some certain relief is proposed and prosecuted. Coos county has millions at stake and we believe she will coalesce with the government or the state in the best and biggest system of salvation that can be arranged.

At least it is our duty to get together and try to solve the riddle lest the "phoenix arise" from ashes we might have prevented and reproach us with wanton neglect of the richest natural store we possess.

A few thousand intelligent and widespread prevention now will be worth untold millions to us in years to come. There is law, and plenty of it, to use in the quest for safety and it should be invoked in and out of season for the holding and profit of the magnificent heritage that is ours.
