

SMITH MAKES STRONG TALK

drunkenness to minimum. It will make for sobriety and decency, for the uplifting of the morals of the community, by making the continuance in business of the liquor dealer depend upon the decency of his own conduct, and obedience to the law, rather than upon the possession of a political pull," said he.

Capt. Smith, derided the idea that temperance and prohibition were one and the same. He said, "Buying four quarts for \$3.20 is not temperance, keeping the jug in the cellar is not temperance; voting prohibition for the other fellow, intending to drink yourself is not temperance; the closing of the open saloon, only to open the blind pig, is not temperance."

His arraignment of the ministers, who by their actions indicated they believe more in man made law than in the efficacy of prayer, was courteous but severe. "God made man a free agent; left it for him to choose whether he would follow the path

of righteousness or the path of sin. Believing as I do, that the Almighty has all wisdom, and that He has the power to make the same impossible if He so wills, I cannot understand one of His ministers on earth attempting to establish a reform by the abolishment of temptation, to undertake to do so is to arrogate to themselves a wisdom superior to that of their master."

"The example and advise of a good mother, the power of love, and the redemption of the blood of the Lamb is the only power that ever has, or ever will prevent a man from straying from the narrow path. It is the only power that ever has or ever will bring the straying Lamb back into the fold."

Capt. Smith insists that the man who believes in temperance should not vote for state wide prohibition, because temperance cannot be brought about by a law that has proven a failure in every state where it has been tried. That the man who believes in local option should vote against prohibition; because local option is founded upon the principles of each community deciding the question for itself.

The man who believes in local option should vote against state wide prohibition because local option is founded upon the idea that communities should have local self government. The man who believes in the abolishment of the Dive should vote against prohibition, because when the law says that the liquor business should cease, the law abiding saloon keeper quits the business, but the Dive keeper continues to defy the law, and remains in the business. The trouble with prohibition, is that it puts the wrong man out of business."

Capt. Smith's tribute to Oregon, was just what would be expected, from a Southerner, who had fallen in love with the state.

to date in number and quality of men in the Oregon Naval Reserve.

With the enlistment of these men, Coos Bay has placed herself in a position where she can well say to the War and Navy Departments, "I am one of the most important ports on the Pacific Coast."

Coos Bay has demonstrated that she has among her citizens men with rich red blood in their veins who are willing to do something for themselves and for Coos Bay.

She is starting out with an institution that will be the pride of Oregon for the personnel of the men in the list is such that the Coos Bay Naval Reserve will not be a failure, but will develop into a splendid body of well-drilled, well-trained men.

In the first instance, it was expected that Coos Bay would be able to raise one division of twenty men; instead, she has succeeded in raising two divisions with a total of eighty-six men, and this does not include the members of the band, all of whom expect to enlist as musicians. The Oregon Naval Reserve is an institution which bears about the same relation to the Navy that the Militia does to the Army, but has several advantages over the Militia organizations. It offers to its members drills and training in seamanship including all things taught in the Navy and in addition offers all drills and training in soldiering that are found in all branches of that service excepting the cavalry. To belong to the organization does not take from a man his personal liberty, nor does it require him to remain permanently at one place. He may move from Coos Bay to any point within the state of Oregon or in the world and such removal is sufficient ground for granting him a discharge. Once a year, the United States Government furnishes a ship free of charge to the members and they have the privilege of taking a two-weeks' trip along the coast and visiting the important ports.

It calls the attention of the Government officials so much to the importance of Coos Bay as a port that
