## STATEMENT NO. 1.

THE Oregon primary law and its various provisions including Statement No. 1, continue to command the interest of the entire country. Iowa recently enacted a primary law and already there is an agitation to adopt Statement No. 1, as a feature. The Des Moines Evening Tribune says:

"The Dubuque Telegraph-Herald proposes to the legislature that it give the Oregon plan a trial in the selection of the coming United States senator.

"The Oregon plan differs from the Iowa primary election law plan in that the people vote for the man they want for senator instead of for the man they want as republican nominee or democratic nominee, and the legislature commits itself to elect whomsoever the people name.

"Under the Oregon plan a republican legislature in Oregon elected a democratic United States senator because he won at the polls.

"There is a great deal to be said for submitting the election of a senator to the people in this direct way, and permitting them to practically elect, just as they do a governor, instead of making a party nomination as our own primary contemplates.

"If the coming legislature should resort to a special primary election the Oregon plan would doubtless be urged by many believers in the direct election of United States senators."

STATEMENT  
IS DENIED

Assertion of Home Rule Association In Reference to Search Feature Is False.

"Do you know that the Prohibitionists of Oregon have put a law on the ballot this year which makes it possible for any officer to break into your home at midnight and search your wife's, mother's or daughter's bedroom for liquor?"

This would-be startling statement is made in a letter sent out by the Greater Oregon Home Rule Association, to the voters of the State. Let it be clearly understood that the search clause which is objected to in the proposed statute, is identically the same word for word, with that found in the present Local Option Law, which the liquor men pretend to favor.

The statement that the name of the person complaining of the violation of this law need not be given, is absolutely false. The process for securing the information which will lead to the issuing of a warrant, for the arrest of a person violating the provisions of the proposed statute, is the same as for the violation of any criminal statute.

We have always had this search feature in our American laws, as seen in the provisions for search for stolen goods, the search for illicit stills. There is not a case on record of the violation of the home in the use of these search privileges.
