#### COOS BAY GOT HER SHARE

To the Editor of "The Coos Bay Times":—

There is a rumor out that the County Court of Coos County, Oregon has not apportioned as great a sum of money for the improvements of roadways, bridges, etc., on the Coos Bay side of the County as it had to the Coquille side of the county, for like improvements. The following is a statement of money apportioned out of the general road fund for the improvements of waterways, roadways, bridges, on the Coos Bay side since 1906 and during the administration of John F. Hall as County Judge, to-wit:

Let us consider a few of the improvements made by the County Court during the administration of John F. Hall:

There is the East Marshfield Ferry which is a great convenience to the people of East Marshfield and Marshfield and to the public in general, and it has come to stay.

The South Slough bridge was built in the year 1910 at an expense of \$12,477.42 which is a great convenience to, and highly appreciated by the people of Coos County.

There has been constructed since 1906 a waterway or canal on Haynes Slough, Kentuck Slough and Catch-

#### ing Slough.

The County during the administration of Judge Hall has adopted a plan that in the construction of new roads or waterways where one-half of the expense thereof is raised by subscription among the people, that the county will donate out of the general road fund one-half of the expenses of such construction.

The County Court during the administration of Judge Hall has also adopted a plan of going over and inspecting all roads, of any importance, at least once a year.

For the construction of the North Slough canal the county apportioned \$2,000, the people of North Bend, North Slough and Ten Mile raised about \$2,300 by subscription, the remainder of the expense was paid by L. J. Simpson, out of his private fund, and amounting to about \$10,000.

North Bend, Marshfield, Allegany, and Willanhe Slough has received liberal apportionments out of the general funds for the construction of their roads.

I make this statement for the reason, as above stated that there is a rumor out that the County Court, during the administration of Judge Hall has not donated the Coos Bay side of the county its share from the general road fund. I ask that you go back over the records and ascertain the amount apportioned from the general road fund for the construction and improvement of roads, and compare the same, with the above statement.
