IN A recent speech Robert H. Fernald of the United States Geological Survey, made the statement that at the rate coal is now consumed, the available supply of the United States will be exhausted by the year 2050.

This prophecy would carry a loud note of alarm if other sources of energy and heat were not now being developed and experimented with. The country is becoming exceedingly interested in the harnessing of streams for the production of electric power. The interest is so intense that the subject has gained its scandals and its set of fire bell journalists before one-tenth of 1 per cent of all the water power of the country has been put to use. As a rule these follow development instead of forming themselves as the advance guard. In southern California and in the desert land of Arizona and Nevada inventors have attained notable success in making the rays of the sun pump water and drive machinery. In one of those inspiring speculations which come only too seldom from the pen of Thomas A. Edison, the prediction is made that long before the full power will have found a way to take energy of electricity has been realized, man gy and heat from the ether waves. For many other reasons this generation need not worry lest it reduce the world to a cold and fuelless sphere for the generation of 150 years hence. Besides there are those 400 square miles of coal lands adjacent to Coos Bay that yet remain to be developed. And unless some of these railway promoters get busy this supply may be here as an incentive for Uncle Sam to do something at least by 2050.

CRIPPEN GETS STAY.

English Law Gives Wife Murderer A Few More Weeks.

LONDON, Nov. 8.—It is officially announced that Dr. Crippen, convicted and sentenced to death for the murder of his wife, Belle-Elmore, will not be executed today as originally arranged, for the reason the law provides two weeks must elapse between the dismissal of the appeal and the carrying out of the sentence. November 23rd has been fixed as the date of execution. Meantime his solicitor is drafting a petition for a reprieve.

COUNTY DEBT IS REDUCED

Coos County Only About \$15,000 Behind at Present Says Judge Hall.

The net indebtedness of Coos County is only about \$15,000 instead of \$113,000 according to a statement by County Judge John F. Hall. The semi-annual statement of County Clerk Watson showed the unpaid warrants amounted to about \$113,000 and this was taken by many to mean that the indebtedness was that amount. However, Judge Hall points out that the funds now held by County Treasurer Dimmick and the amounts due the county will reduce this to about \$15,000, the debt of the county having been reduced about \$35,000 since 1906. Concerning the matter, Judge Hall made the following statement:

"I note in your issue of November 3 that you state that the indebtedness of Coos County is over \$113,000. This is an error. If you will examine the report of the County Treasurer, October 1, 1910, you will find that he reports cash on hand for the redemption of county warrants \$49,700 or thereabouts, and cash collected in bonds of sheriff something over \$17,000.00 making in all a little over \$68,000. Take this from \$113,000 leaves an actual indebtedness of \$45,000. You also note from the report of the clerk that there is \$30,000 uncollected taxes, leaving a net indebtedness of \$15,000. October 1, 1906, the net indebtedness was over \$50,000."

QUAKE IS FELT.

Six Distinct Shocks Recorded Sunday at Spokane.

SPOKANE, Nov. 8.—The most distinct earthquake shock yet recorded by the seismograph at Gonzaga College in this city, was felt between 12:52 Sunday when six distinct waves ending at 1:09, center, were recorded. The estimate is at 530 miles southeast of Spokane near the Wyoming-Utah boundary.
