DIES VERY SUDDENLY.

Stage Driver Passes Away at Camas Valley Home.

ROSEBURG, Ore., Nov. 8.—Henry Benham, aged 23 years, and a son of W. C. Benham, a well known stage driver employed by C. P. Barnard, died very suddenly last week at his home at Camas Valley. He was found in bed by members of the household shortly after 7 o'clock, the other appearances tending to show that he had been dead for several hours. Aside from his father he is survived by a mother, who is at present at Corvallis, and three brothers, John, of Coquille City; Robert, of Camas Valley, and Will who is attending school at Corvallis. According to friends, the deceased retired as usual last evening and showed no signs, whatever of illness. His death is attributed to heart trouble.
