W. L. TOOZE JR. ANSWERS HALL

Replies to Criticism of Address By Marshfield Minister.

Editor Times:

Least people may be misled by the vicious attack made upon me in the Monday Times by the "Most Rev. (?) G. LeRoy Hall, I desire to say a few words.

1st. I want to say that I am not a Minister of the Gospel, and do not pretend to know all about the Bible, but I respect the Bible enough not to use it in the same breath with the vulgar term "Booze." That in my address I incidentally mentioned the fact that the Bible commanded a temperate use of alcoholic beverages, taking as my authority the following sixth verse of the 31st Chapter of Proverbs:

"Give strong drink unto him that is ready to perish and wine unto those that be of heavy hearts."

2nd. That my principal and only object in using bible quotations in my address was to show that the wine of Biblical times was intoxicating, and I think the Bible clearly shows that "There is no 28th Leviticus." This citation was a printer's error. The citation should be 23rd Leviticus, verse 13.

3rd. I contend that the Bible does not teach the prohibition theory, though it does teach temperance. If Mr. Hall can show me wherein the Bible teaches prohibition, I will gladly forsake the stand I have taken. It does not, and he knows it, still he uses his Church, which is supposed to be founded entirely upon the Bible, to the promotion of something the Bible does not teach. I am working for temperance, and that is the only thing that he should work for through his church. Prohibition is not temperance.

4th. Though Rev. (?) Mr. Hall apparently would have us believe that he is a deep student of the Bible, still he evidently has not heard of that old passage in the Bible, termed "The Golden Rule," else he would not have stooped to make the attack upon me that he did, and try to hold me up to Public Ridicule. I venture to say that my "Booze" record, as he terms it, is probably as spotless, if not more so, than his own.

I deem his attack most uncharitable and not becoming to a teacher of God's Word.

5th. I am sincere in what I advocate, and speak only the truth. I defy Mr. Hall or anyone else to prove otherwise.

6th. In conclusion, I desire to

call my friend Hall's attention to a careful study of the first five verses at least of Christ's Sermon on the Mount, Chapter seven of The Book St. Matthew, and particularly to Chapter 3:—

"And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye?"—But what is the use..... "Judge not that ye be not judged."
