## URGES AID OF THE RESERVES

"Booster" Tells Why Coos Bay Divisions Should Be Assisted In Every Way.

Editor Times:

A thing has happened on Coos Bay which is of the very greatest importance not only to Marshfield but to the entire Port of Coos Bay. In accordance with the spirit of the times and the desire of the government to have as many of the men of the United States as possible trained in military and naval affairs, (and deeming it of such vital interest that immediate action should be taken) the governor of the state of Oregon during the month of August last issued his proclamation authorizing the formation of eight divisions of Naval Reserves within the state.

Of necessity and for the reason that we are so well and favorably situated upon the finest harbor in Oregon, Coos Bay was called upon for a division of at least twenty men. With the usual Coos Bay spirit enough of our splendid young men at once offered their services to enable us to have Two Divisions of upwards of Eighty men, or more than four times as many as the officials thought we could furnish.

Already these have met every obstacle presented and have pushed forward with the organizations to such an extent that they have begun drilling and training and have attracted the most favorable comment from those familiar with things military on account of the fine showing of the men.

At present there is no appropriation available for the purpose of furnishing uniforms for the men and therefore unless the loyal and patriotic citizens of the Bay get together and purchase these uniforms, the men will either have to purchase them for themselves or else will be compelled to drill and parade in civilian clothes for the next seven or eight months—a thing which will spoil the appearance of the very best drilled body of men.

Now, these selfsame energetic men are coming forward and in many cases are offering to buy their own uniforms. What is the matter with the rest of us? Where is our pride? Where is our sense of honor and civic decency? Why don't the citizens of Marshfield buy the uniforms for the boys and by so doing show that we are behind such admirable efforts on the part of our boys?

We expect our Naval Reserves to do more in the way of getting Coos Bay to the front and in advertising it and in calling the attention of the government to its necessities than

anything else can do, even more than Thousands of Dollars spent in the ordinary way can do. It means that in every probability Coos Bay will secure the presence of United States War vessels in this port and perhaps be made a torpedo station. It means that the government will more than likely hasten the necessary harbor and bar improvements here.

The uniforms cost comparatively little yet it is unjust and unfair that our boys who are giving their time and best efforts to the organization should be allowed to buy their own uniforms. During the coming summer the two divisions will go on a cruise to other ports along the coast and will visit numerous of the larger cities. We want them properly uniformed then and we want them to make the best appearance of any of the Reserves either from Oregon, California or Washington.

Let's show our old time spirit. Let's unite in the "Uniform Day" Thursday and buy the uniforms for the boys.
