LOOKING BACKWARD.

Of all sad words that bring us woe, The worst are these "I told you so."

ONCE more the people of Oregon and the nation have expressed themselves on the men and measures of their state and country. Nationally the verdict is extraordinary and to a minor extent the same is true locally. The defeat of Mr. Bowerman is regrettable and while there were a number of contributory causes there is little doubt that a rebuke of assemblyism was the prime cause. The Times was against the assembly but it felt that republicans had more to hope for from Bowerman's election than a democrat. The fact that other assembly nominees were elected does not alter the fact that was what defeated Bowerman. The people looked upon the head of the ticket as representative of the old system and struck blindly. Mr. Bowerman's avowals of friendliness could not offset the fact that he was the representative of the system sought to be rebuked.

JUDGE COKE.

WE OF Coos county while regretting the loss of the head of the ticket, because of the faith felt in Mr. Bowerman and his splendid ability, can congratulate ourselves on the sweeping election of Judge Coke. Seldom is a man given such a splendid expression of confidence and belief in his high intent as was accorded Judge Coke by the electorate of his district. Everywhere his vote was most extraordinary. It was the commanding figure in the returns everywhere and is something for which Judge Coke and

his friends and republicans generally may well be proud.

TOO MANY MEASURES.

ONE thing demonstrated by the recent election was that there were entirely too many measures voted on. There should be some method by which a limit might be placed on the number of measures submitted at any one election. This limit would permit the individual voter to better inform himself and result in a more discriminating and intelligent verdict at the polls. Although generally the results gave evidence of the display of good judgment.

GOOD ROADS.

GOOD roads got a good majority. This will permit counties to issue bonds for construction of improved highways whenever the people of a county think it feasible. This is one of the good features of the election and will doubtless give an impulse to good road building throughout the state. A state good roads convention in Portland is one of the early developments of the election victory. It is planned to have a number of authorities on good roads present and representatives from the various counties of the state. Coos county should be represented.
