BIG BUSINESS IN NORTHWEST

Wireless Company, Now Under Investigation, Has Many Stockholders.

(By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.)
SEATTLE, Wash., Nov. 23.—Fred H. Shoemaker, who until June was fiscal agent for Oregon, Washington and Northern Idaho for the Continental Wireless Telephone and Telegraph Company now under investigation by the postoffice department, says he began to sell the stock of the Collins Wireless eighteen months ago. He employed twelve agents and the sales brought in one hundred thousand dollars. The largest sales were in Spokane and to one large investor in Idaho. Shoemaker's own father invested \$5,000. Last March the Collins Wireless consolidated with the Massey-Clark and Pacific Wireless Telegraph Company's and the Consolidated Company is known as Continental Wireless Telephone and Telegraph Companies. Not much stock of the new company was sold but investors in the Collins Company were urged to take in exchange stock in the new company. Many did so.
