**KEEP NEWS SECRET.**

Mexican Government Exercises Right of Censorship.

MEXICO CITY, Mex., Nov. 23.—There is great difficulty in getting authentic reports from the disturbed sections. The censorship is strict and in many instances the government has taken possession of the telegraph wires to the exclusion at least of press dispatches. In spite of this direct wires from Orizaba, and Guadalupe telling of severe fighting have been received. The authorities minimize the gravity of the situation but there is a general feeling of uneasiness at the capitol.
