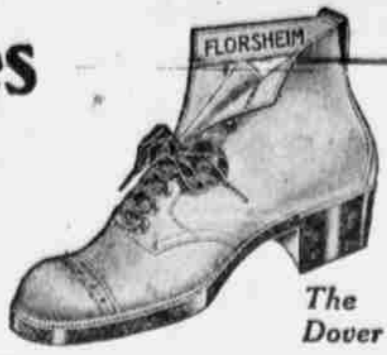

Capt. Macgenn Praises Improvements of Local Harbor. The Portland Oregonian says: "Dredging in the channel between Marshfield and the ocean, for which the Port of Coos Bay will collect a tax of \$300,000 and the government has appropriated \$50,000, has been begun, and it is expected that by the time the Panama Canal is completed Coos Bay will become a seaport of importance."
