Many Entries For Annual Municipal Election There Expected.

City politics in North Bend are beginning to liven up a bit and a lively race for councilmen is anticipated. The caucus probably won't see as warm a contest as the election will as the city charter provides for two candidates for each office going on the ticket.

So far, no opposition to L. J. Simpson for mayor has been talked of and it would not be unlikely if he has it his own way. City Recorder Derbyshire may also be without opposition. C. S. Winsor is said to be a candidate for treasurer but whether J. W. Gardiner, the present incumbent, will run again has not been announced.

Four councilmen are to be elected and a half-dozen candidates are being talked of. Councilmen Logg, and Hoelling will probably seek re-election. R. A. Wernich and Henry Kern, who are filling vacancies by appointment will probably be candidates and L. F. Falkenstein and Robert Emory are also being talked of.
