Tuesday, the 13th day of December, 1910, for the improvement of that portion of Front Street North from the north line of Alder avenue east to the south line of Elm avenue east in the City of Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon, according to the plans and specifications on file in the office of the Recorder and open to the inspection of all persons interested therein.

Bids will be received for the whole work necessary to complete the proposed improvement and also for each class of work included therein i. e., for the bulkhead and piling, for the grading, for curbing and paving the roadway and for the sidewalks.
