Nothing has been left to chance. Expert architects and landscape gardeners planned the city. The city's growth for 50 years hence has been anticipated. Future boulevards, parks, sites for public buildings and

streets have all been located already. The regulations as to developing property protect the land owner and increase the value of his property. The gardens, open spaces and playgrounds add to the value of the land and yield a return to the owner, as well as the community. The beauty of Duesseldorf has not only increased the value of land in the city and the suburbs, but has lured population in enormous numbers.
