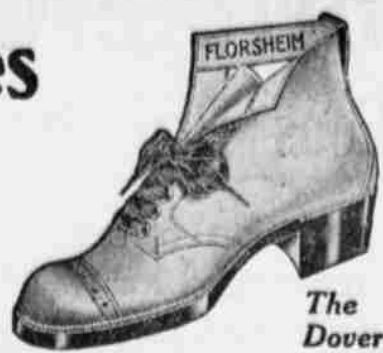

COACH ON FIRE.

Passengers On Coquille Train Given Scare.

The Coquille Sentinel says: "On the morning trip of the train from Marshfield Monday a decided scare was thrown into the passengers and as a result the train was stopped midway between the Junction and the Summit. The occasion of the scare and the necessary stop was the catching on fire of the first class coach. The fire caught from the stove and when first noticed had gained considerable headway, the roof of the coach was on fire and before the train could be stopped was blazing merrily. However, water was got on the blazing woodwork as soon as the train was stopped and the fire was readily extinguished. The coach was full of passengers and a stampede nearly resulted when the fire was first seen."

SCHOOL CENSUS FIGURES.

O. C. Sanford, clerk of the Coquille school district, completed the taking of the school census of this district a short time since and his figures show there are 478 children of a school age within the limits of the school district. Of this number 237 are males and 241 females. Last year's census shows a school population of 469, there being a gain of nine in the past year.—Coquille Sentinel.

E. C. Roberts has just completed the taking of the school census for this district and finds that there are 373 children of the required age in this district—186 males and 187 females. This is an increase to number of 33 over last year and the addition to the district from the Rackeoff district was made before last year's census was taken.—Myrtle Point Enterprise.
