Uniforms Coming.—Lieut. Stone of the Marshfield Naval Reserves, Saturday evening received a telegram stating that the uniforms for the Marshfield divisions had been shipped from Bremerton to Portland and would arrive here on the first boat from the Rose City this week. Sixty-four uniforms are coming.
