vements as are now contemplated. It is the board's intention to cut down the current expenses of the schools for the ensuing year.

Undesirable's Secure Licenses to Run Saloons There.

TILLAMOOK, Ore., Dec. 30.—The city council at a special meeting approved the bonds of five new saloons and licenses for the firms were ordered issued. The men securing them are:

W. J. Stephens, who has been convicted of gambling and bootlegging; Laughlin & Johnson, the former convicted of bootlegging, and the latter of gambling and bootlegging; Clyde Clemens, who was twice convicted of bootlegging and served a term in the county jail on the second offense; Ed. Hadley, who has also served a term in jail for a second conviction of bootlegging and other offenses, and Patterson & Wayrick, newcomers here.

As a result of the licensing of saloons there has been a great increase in drunkenness and disorderly conduct. One of the three night watchmen was knocked down by a crowd of drunken roughs, and a woman was knocked off the sidewalk into the mud of the street by a band of hoodlums.
