"The owner or persons having in charge any dog kept or owned within the city of Marshfield shall on or before the first day of January in each year pay to the city recorder the sum of three dollars for each and every male dog; the sum of \$5 for each and every female dog, which shall entitle him to a receipt from he city recorder designating the owners' name and the number of
