## BILL WORDING WAS CHANGED

### Coos Bay Wagon Road Grant Says "One Person," and Not "Actual Settler."

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 3. — The Oregonian prints the following:

The substitution by a clerk of the words "one person" for the expression "actual settlers," in the Coos Bay Wagon Road land grant bill, while the bill was being transferred from the Oregon and California land grant law, over which the alleged violation of which a suit is now held under advisement by Federal Judge Wolverton.

Whether the omission was intentional or accidental is not generally known, but it made considerable difference as to the manner in which 100,000 acres of Southern Oregon land could be bought. The clerk's error is believed to be brief.

"Provided further, That the grant of lands hereby made shall be upon the condition that the lands shall be sold to any one person only in quantities not greater than one quarter section and at a price not exceeding \$2.50 per acre."

The change was not discovered. The amendment was concurred in by the Senate, and in its changed form was enrolled, signed by the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House, and approved by the President the next day, thus becoming law.

**Early Fight Recalled.** The suit brought Tuesday to cancel title to 96,676.96 acres of valuable Oregon timber land, and its connection with the names of Collis P. Huntington, Charles Crocker, Leland Stanford and Mark Hopkins, revives recollections of the efforts on the part of these four to secure control of the Oregon & California Railroad Company as early as 1875 and 1876. The road became insolvent and passed into the hands of a receiver, the Southern Pacific finally succeeding in securing control.

It is alleged in the complaint against the Southern Oregon Company, brought over the Coos Bay Wagon Road grant, that Huntington and his associates secured this land through John Miller. The fact that the lands were afterward mortgaged and passed out of the hands of these men leads to the inference that had planned to build a railroad at early date from Roseburg to Bay, but that having failed to secure control of the Oregon & California Railroad they abandoned the

ited States Senator Tillman is to have entered into negotiations with Attorneys Reed & Watson of Marshfield, to compel the sale of this land, given by Congress under the grant, to sell to himself and 10 of his relatives 160 acres for \$2.50 an acre. Representatives of the government have always held the position that the law permitted but did not compel the Coos Wagon Road Company or its successors to sell the land in blocks of 160 acres each at \$2.50 an acre. Senator Tillman was persuaded, it is said, that the law compelled sale to anyone who applied for the land.

Mills, who came here from New York and who has a family of three children, said that he had borrowed money to move across the continent and was working on the side to lift the debt. The affair has made much talk among the congregation and about town.
