NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS.

Notice is hereby given that A annual licenses on dogs in the city of Marshfield are now due. The cliy ordinance provides as follows:

"The owner or persons having in charge any dog kept or owned within the city of Marshfield shall on 0 before the first day of January 1 each year pay to the city records the sum of three dollars for each and every male don; the sum of \$5 to each and every female dog, which shall entitle him to a receipt from the city recorder designating the owners' name and the number of

the license." All dogs found within the city limits of the city of Marshfield without a license tag will be taken up by the city marshal and \$1 extra will be charged for same and if no paid then, the dog will be killed
