#### CRAWFORD'S OPINIONS ON

OREGON'S COUNTY TAX LAW Counties Have Exclusive Control Over Taxation, Subject to Law

Voted by State as a Whole. SALEM, Ore., Jan. 3 .- In discus sing the county tax or so-called singie tax amendment Attorney-General Crawford passed on several features of it which have been puzzling the people of this and other states ever since the election. He holds that a county may declare what shall be taxed or exempted by school districts, cities or ports within its borders, subject In some instances to the charters or acts which are the fundamental law for the districts, eities or ports.

He also holds that it is possible for a county to initiate and adopt a measure regulating taxation or exemptions at the next election, even in the absence of a general statute prescribing a method of procedure. But, he states, the legislature may adopt a directing statute, this staute to prescribe the mode or method of procedure at the election to pass Vice-president McKnight today. "We on the question of taxation or exemptions.

Voters-at-Large Have Voice. The attorney-General is of the opinion that if the voters at large should adopt a law declaring what should not be exempted, that a county could not enact a valid-measure in conflict with such general statute. But, on the other hand, counties may have exclusive control over taxations and exemptions in its own boundaries subject to any general law which may subsequently be enacted by the whole people.


