

ARE AT HOME IN NEW QUARTERS

Oregon Power Co. and Title Guarantee and Abstract Co. Have Moved.

Marshfield's advancement in metropolitan airs was never more in evidence than in the handsome new quarters of the Oregon Power Company and the Title Guarantee and Abstract Company in the new Coke building. Both firms have moved this week into their new quarters and while not fully settled they make a splendid showing.

The Oregon Power Company occupy the corner room which has been handsomely finished and with a tessellated tile flooring and its fine fixtures gives it a thoroughly metropolitan appearance. Manager Jennings is to be congratulated. It proves he knows how to fit an office as well as manage the concern.

The Title Guarantee and Abstract Company occupy the first room adjoining the main entrance. It has been fitted like the Oregon Power Co's office with bank fixtures and with a large rear work room is so arranged as to bring the entire working force into systematic touch with each other. It is an office that is a credit to its manager, Henry Sengstacken, and the city of Marshfield as well.

HALL LOSES GUN.

Coos County Man Is Robbed Near Roseburg.

ROSEBURG, Ore., Jan. 6.—Hardly had George Quine assumed the office of sheriff of Douglas county this morning when he received a telephone message from Riddle to the effect that a Coos county resident named Hall, who is travelling through the country by private conveyance, had been robbed of a valuable gun some time last night. With no clue, other than a description of the gun, Sheriff Quine and Deputy Sam Starmer immediately set to work, and after an hour's search found the weapon in the possession of the Rhoades second hand store. From one of the clerks to whom the fellow had sold the gun a fair description of the man was obtained, and shortly after he was arrested at Moore's livery barn as he was about to leave town. When taken into custody he gave his name as Byron Allen, in Roseburg. Like most persons arrested for crimes of this nature, he professed innocence, and claimed that he had purchased the gun from a "half-breed" whom he met in the vicinity of Riddle. He was recommitted to the state reform school.
