H. L. Stephens, the Fishtrap model farmer, returned from Portland recently, having been to the metrophis coming year's seed crop of
his grain, ete., which was accomplished
without difficulty. So thorough is without difficulty. So thorough is
Mr. Stephens in his farming meth-
ods, and the soll and climatle condiods, and the soll and climatic condi-
tions of Coos county are so excellent that the grain and seed he raises
have become so well known as to have become so well known as to
create a demand for them far in excess of his ability to supply.
His princlpal crops are peas, oats, barley and wheat. Last
season from 40 acres of garden pent season from 40 acres of garden peas
he sold about 84,000 worth of seed.
In 190938 acres of oats averaged
season, whteh was an unusually dry
one, hiss oats and barley averaged
118 bushels per acre.
